Here are a few statistics about Living Hope:

Living hope High School graduated their first class in 2013. They had 20 kids in each class; so far they have graduated 160. On average 10 out of 20 goes on to higher education, college, university and technical schools. Right now there are 65 kids in college and 35 have graduated from college. There are teachers, Ministers, a dentist, several doctors in medical school getting ready to graduate; there are chefs, zoologist, and several Engineers.

graduates will keep their silver dollar and give it to their First born when they graduate from high school. At last year's graduation, we took a survey of how many grads still had their Silver dollar. All but two were saving them to give their children when they graduate.

Living Hope Blessings


- Living Hope got a wonderful gift from the New York Tully Rotary Club for new textbooks. They have them all covered with plastic so they will last and we will continue to distribute them to students when they come back in two weeks. This is the first time in 12 years that everybody has a book for every subject.
- They lost one of our teachers and have found a new replacement, He will start on May 3rd. He will be teaching Geography and Math.
- Riverton United Methodist Church has donated new mattresses for the form ones.
- Donna Coblintz and her family have donated 20 welcome kits, personal items and have paid for the shipping.
- An Individual donated 20 new bibles and money for graduation.
- The new replacement cow got bred in June and had a new little bull calf last week. He was so big and we called him Big Boy. The Nurse wants to buy him as soon as he is weaned.
- The Government has said that the schools will open as scheduled on May 3rd.

Needs

- Blankets for all the new kids, \$200 for 20 blankets, \$120 for 20 pillows
- 20 pairs of uniforms that are \$20 each
- Our buckets of hope project is in the negative. The hard times have just begun, many people are hungry. It costs us \$30 for each bucket and contents. We can't give out any more until we get some Donations.
- A printer for the computer room. Students are now able to send their sponsors emails letters and can then also print out the emails they get from their sponsors.
- Donations for putting in Wi-Fi system instead of buying data bundles. Right now we spent \$60-\$80 a month and the Wi-Fi will be much more economical. Computer skills are an absolute necessity no matter what the students do in future.
- At least once a week we have a black out and no electricity which means no water. Sometimes it last for an hour and sometimes a whole week. It's frustrating. Living Hope would like to explore the possibility of putting solar power at least in the Dining Hall so the kids can study.
- That the past form ones get sponsored and the new incoming form 1's do as well.
